A SPECIAL DAY FOR THE FOCAL AWARD COMMITTEE

On a beautiful and sunny mid-June afternoon, the FOCAL Award Committee convened at the lovely, Spanish-style John C. Fremont Branch of LAPL. Our hostess, Children's Librarian Lisa Schloss, provided the branch's Community Room for the committee meeting.

Past Chair Carol Raby and FOCAL President Caroline Gill joined committee members Lesley Alexander-Roxas, Caroline Arnold, Hillary George, Marcia Melkonian, Lisa Schloss, Barbara Stone and Chair Nancy Reich as we enjoyed a potluck repast provided by the attendees during which we had a chance to chitchat with each other before addressing the task at hand.

At our first meeting, the committee discussed eleven nominations and chose four finalists. A lively discussion of the merits of the four finalists was enlightening, as each member shared her viewpoints and opinions with her colleagues. When discussion ceased, the group was ready to vote.

Four ballots were distributed to each member and we reviewed the numerical rating of 4 for excellent, to 1 for poor, and the five qualities to be considered: high standards of excellence in literature for young people, literary and/or artistic merit, interest and readability, universality, and California enrichment content.

The room suddenly quieted and the tension built as each voting member deliberated on the rating she would assign to each quality for each of the four finalists. Carol Raby collected the completed anonymous ballots and she sequestered herself in a corner of the room. Anticipation grew as Carol tabulated the scores for each of the four titles and validated the results on her calculator.

Finally, she rejoined us to announce the winning title. Prefacing her announcement, she stated that the vote of the top two titles was very close, but the 2012 winner was ONE DAY AND ONE AMAZING MORNING ON ORANGE STREET by California author Joanne Rocklin.

Set on a very short street in an unnamed Southern California neighborhood, the lone surviving orange tree of a once-huge orchard plays the role of being a focal point for a close-knit, diverse, multi-cultural, and multigenerational group of neighbors.

Our winning author, Joanne Rocklin, is excited and honored that her book has been chosen for this year's FOCAL award. She is looking forward to joining the FOCAL members at the Award luncheon on January 12. 2013. Do plan on attending this joyful event!



- The contest is open to kids grades 3-8.
 Three winners will be selected, one each from grades 3-4, 5-6, and 7-8.
- Entries are due December 7, 2012, and must be postmarked by then. Late entries will not be accepted.
- No more than 300 words (fewer than 300 is fine).
- Submit typed entries on clean, white 8.5"x11" paper only.
- Put the child's name on the back of the essay and on the entry form.
- Check spelling, punctuation and grammar CAREFULLY. Mistakes will disqualify the entry.
- No more than 3 entries per classroom.
- Winners will be notified by January 1, 2013, and will be asked to read their essays at the FOCAL Award luncheon on Saturday, January 12, 2013.
