It was my intention – honestly – to telephone our honoree, Brenda Woods, and find out when it would be convenient for her to spend some time advising me of some facts of her life. Instead of setting up a future time for our “interview,” Ms. Woods and I spoke for more than an hour, nonstop. Still, nothing I can write can communicate the warmth and vivacity of this woman.

I can recite the facts, but you will have to meet Ms. Woods to really appreciate her. Born in Cincinnati, Ohio, the second oldest of seven children, Ms. Woods came to Los Angeles in 1958 and spent her childhood in the Los Angeles area. Her major in college was Public Health, followed by graduate work as a physical therapist. She still works five days a week at this profession and after 27 years finds it challenging. One would think that with her writing (she is on her third book now), she could not find time for additional activities. However, as a divorced mother of two sons, she became expert at multi-tasking, so it’s not surprising that she is painting the outside of her home, agreeing only to have help with the upper area.



Her mother is a retired Los Angeles school teacher who is also a dynamo, returning to university at age 48, after being a key-punch operator (some of our more mature readers will remember this pre-computer skill), while her eldest daughter, Brenda, acted as chief baby-sitter for the younger five children. At this time, Ms. Woods’ older son is married and has an eight-months-old daughter, Alexandra, affectionately known as “the dumpling.” We have invited Ms. Woods to include this young lady and her parents as guests at the Award luncheon, so that Alexandra is made aware of her grandmother’s achievements.

WATTS TOWER EXHIBIT

On Sunday, October 23rd, at the Watts Tower Arts Center, a reception was presented by the Italian Oral History Institute to welcome the new exhibit, “Leo Politi, Artist of the Angels”—a retrospective of this artist’s remarkable 50 year legacy here in Los Angeles as an illustrator and author/illustrator. Dignitaries, family members, and friends were treated to speeches remembering and honoring the warmth, generosity and talent that Leo Politi displayed throughout his life.

The highlight of the afternoon, however, was a talk by Ann Stalcup, one of the curators of the exhibit, as well as the author of the recent biography, *Leo Politi: Artist of the Angels*. In her talk she described first meeting Leo Politi in 1979 at an Olvera street event—the Blessing of the Animals. From time to time, over their long friendship they would meet for dinner at Phillippe’s Restaurant, Politi always ordering the beef stew. She recalled the long wait it took to get a book autographed—there had to be an illustration with each signature! It was recollections like these that made Ann’s talk so memorable. When Politi died in 1996, Ann felt she had to write his biography. We thank Ann for persevering with her task so that we may all become acquainted with Leo Politi’s touching life story.

For those who were unable to attend the reception, the exhibit will continue through December 4th at Watts Tower Arts Center, 1727 East 107th Street in Los Angeles.

Ann will speak at the FOCAL Award luncheon on December 3rd. Copies will be available for purchase and autographing.
